1. Introduction to Gender

In English, nouns can be divided into four types of gender:

1. **Masculine Gender** - Names of male persons or animals.
 - Example: Father, King, Lion, Boy
2. **Feminine Gender** - Names of female persons or animals.
 - Example: Mother, Queen, Lioness, Girl
3. **Common Gender** - Names that can be used for both males and females.
 - Example: Doctor, Teacher, Child, Student
4. **Neuter Gender** - Names of non-living things.
 - Example: Table, Chair, Book, Car
